Bee Diseases Insurance provides insurance cover for individual beekeepers, association apiaries and commercial beekeepers alike, against the possibility of their bees and equipment being destroyed as a result of a Destruction Order being levied by a visiting officer from MAFF.

The most common disease resulting in destruction is American foul brood but insurance also covers European foul brood at the moment. It should be borne in mind that colonies infected with Varroasis will be weakened and are therefore more susceptible to infection by AFB/EFB.

Scheme A provides cover for the beekeeper with a total of 39 hives or less. Cover is usually obtained through a member's association although a group of eight or more people can also make an application for cover. Initial enquiries should be made through local associations which will refer the applicant to the Scheme A Manager.

Scheme B provides cover for beekeepers with 40 or more colonies in total. Insurance under this Scheme is on a personal basis and further details can be obtained from the Scheme B Manager.

REMEMBER: DISEASE CAN STRIKE ANY COLONY AT ANY TIME AND IT IS SPREAD THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. PROTECT YOUR APIARY THROUGH B.D.I.

BEEKEEPING AT WRITTLE COLLEGE

Essex is one of the few counties which has a full time County Beekeeping Instructor whose job covers all aspects of beekeeping education. Advice to the general public on bees, beekeeping, hive produce, pollination and insecticide sprays is one aspect of the job, nightschool classes and dayschools for new and experienced beekeepers is another. Instruction for the full time college students and local schools and associations also comes within this brief. There are also opportunities for residential week long courses and long weekend breaks for new beekeepers and experienced apiarists.

A number of out apiaries are maintained for more advanced beekeeping courses and specialist activities such as queen rearing.

Courses:

A number of courses are run at various centres in the county. In the winter months the theoretical aspects of beekeeping are covered. Some of these classes are specifically geared to the BBKA examinations. In the summer, when the honeybees are active, practical beekeeping classes are run so that students can learn the techniques of handling bees.

Every Individual Member of BBKA and every fully paid-up member of a Beekeeping Association affiliated to BBKA is indemnified under Saturn Public Liability policies for sums which they may become legally liable to pay in respect of claims arising out of beekeeping activities made against them for injury or for damage to property. The cover extends to maximum of $\pounds 2,000,000$ arising from any one accident or series of accidents. The beekeeper must bear the first $\pounds 250$ of each and every claim.

Two other types of insurance are available to beekeepers:

- 1. The "All Risks" which covers loss of or damage to hives and equipment
- The BBKA Combined Insurance Scheme for Member Associations, which covers various activities of associations.

AIMS

This Charitable Trust was established in 1990 through the generosity of Mr. C.B. Dennis. It aims to use the interest from the capital investment of £65,000 to support British research projects that are likely to benefit beekeeping in the relatively short term, giving some priority to work on bee diseases. The total amount of income available for award annually is only about £5,000. This will allow the Trust to help existing projects or support short term investigations but not to initiate new areas of research.

The Trust is an independent body making awards to institutions or individuals on the basis of scientific merit of submitted proposals and perceived benefit to British beekeeping. Eight awards have been made to date and the following examples illustrate the diversity honey bee research supported.

Dr. Ingrid Williams of Rothamsted Experimental Station was assisted in the collection and analysis of data on pollination practice in the UK; information that is rarely published but essential for apiculture to be recognised as a vital component of sustainable agriculture in the nineties and beyond. The results of this work were presented in the lecture Dr. Williams gave at the BBKA Spring Convention in April 1992 and have now been published as part of wider studies.

Dr. William Kirk of the University of Keele, Staffordshire received support over three years to produce an updated and comprehensive colour guide to the pollen loads of honey bees in Britain. This practical aid to beekeepers has now been published and is an essential text for those who wish to identify the pollen sources of their bees.

Other awards have been made to Mark Allen of Rothamsted Experimental Station who aimed to develop a rapid, specific and sensitive serological test for detecting honey bee viruses in the parasitic mite *Varroa jacobsoni*, to the International Bee Research Association for portable

computer equipment that could be used to increase the availability of their extensive databases to the beekeeping public at meetings and shows and to Fani Hatjina, a student at Cardiff University, to enable her to complete her studies on means of improving the efficiency of pollination by honey bees.

Application forms for research project funding and guidance notes for applicants are available on request from the Secretary.

The BBKA was originally made up of private members only. However as County Associations were formed they applied for affiliation and were later permitted to send delegates to meetings of the Central Association, as the private members were then known. This arrangement became unsatisfactory as the voting power of the Central Association greatly outnumbered that of the County Associations and so in 1945 a new Constitution was drawn up whereby the Council comprised Delegates from the Counties and Specialist Member Associations. The private members then formed themselves into a Specialist Member Association with the designation 'The Central Association of the British Beekeepers' Association'; this was later shortened to its present style.

The Association was able to devote itself to its own particular aims, to promote interest in current thought and findings about beekeeping and aspects of entomology related to honeybees and other social insects. Lectures given by scientists and other specialists are arranged, printed and circulated to members, as has been done since 1879.

Meetings are held in London at the Linnean Society, Burlington House, Piccadilly W1, with an annual Conference in Leamington Spa in October. The subscription is $\pounds 9.00$ per annum, $\pounds 10.00$ for joint membership (one copy only of publications).

EXAMINATIONS

The Board conducts five grades of examinations at the annual Summer Course at Gormanston College: Preliminary, Intermediate, Senior, Lecturer, Honey Judge. Preliminary Examinations are also held at Provincial centres in May each year.

EDUCATION

The Federation Examinations are recognised as Third Level Exhaminations by the National Council foe Educational Awards (NCEA), thus candidates who pass the Senior Examination may apply to the NCAE for a National Certificate in Science (Apiculture) and candidates who have passed the Lectureship Examination and who have at least two years experience as Lecturers and who have also gained a sufficient standing in the beekeeping community may apply to the NCEA for a Diploma in Science (Apiculture), these awards are conferred by the Cork Institute of Technology (CIT) under a programme of Experiential Learning, for the Diploma a comprehensive Portfolio must be submitted to CIT, successful candidates are entitled to use the qualification NatDipSc (Apic). Courses for beginners are run by Affiliated Associations and the FIBKA holds an Annual Summer Course in Gormanston College in July. The course caters for three grades of students: beginners, intermediate, and senior and covers the theory and practice of modern apiculture. Examinations are held in these grades and also at Honey Judge and Lecturer level. The Examination Board for the National Diploma in Beekeeping was set up in 1954 to meet a need for a beekeeping qualification above the level of the highest certificate awarded by the English, Scottish, Welsh and Ulster Associations.

The Diploma Examination, as designed by the Board, was considered to be an appropriate qualifaction for a County Beekeeping Lecturer or a specialist appointment requiring a high level of academic and practical ability in beekeeping. It is the highest beekeeping qualification recognised in the British Isles and a high percentage of the past and present holders of the Diploma have given distinguished service to beekeeping education at all levels.

Although the post of County Beekeeping Lecturer has virtually disappeared, this has merely emphasised the need for some beekeepers to face the challenge of this examination and maintain the high level skills and knowledge needed to keep pace with the increased problems facing all beekeepers at the present time.

The Board consists of representatives from a wide range of organisations and from Government Departments and together form an impressive amalgam of expert knowledge in Beekeeping and Education. Although the National Beekeeping Associations are represented on the Board it is entirely independent of them.

Normally the highest certificate of one of the National Associations is a necessary criterion for eligibility to take the Examination for the Diploma which is held in alternate years. The Written Examination, taken in March consists of two three hour papers. The Practical, in three sections plus a viva-voce is held in June.

The Board also organises an Advanced Beekeeping Course covering certain parts of the syllabus, that are difficult to cover by independent study. Lasting a working week, they cover the main sections of the Syllabus and represent the highest level of training available to British Beekeepers at the present time. The outside lecturers are each acknowledged experts in their particular field. For the past two years the Board have been privileged to hold their course at the National Bee Unit at Sand Hutton, York.For further details regarding the Diploma write, enclosing a stamped A.4, to the Secretary.

Rothamsted is the oldest laboratory in the world devoted to agricultural research, having started in 1843, and has a total staff of around 500. Research on bees at Rothamsted has been continuous since 1923 and a number of eminent bee scientists, among them Dr. Bailey, Dr. Butler, Dr. Free, Dr. Ribbands, Dr. Simpson and Dr. Stevenson were pioneers in their particular research areas.

The expertise at Rothamsted in honey bee pathology and pollination ecology is unparalleled and the modern laboratories with a range of specialised equipment facilitate research on diverse topics. Experienced apiary staff maintain c.100 honey bee colonies at different locations and the bee field station houses a behaviour laboratory, observation hive room and bee flight room. Facilities for field crop studies are available on site and experimental design and analysis are backed up by good statistical support.

RESEARCH PROGRAMME

Prof. Ingrid Williams leads a group investigating the interaction between bees, crops and the environment and the efficient management of native bees for crop pollination. Pollination studies focus on oil-seed rape, field beans, sunflowers, linseed, lupins and white clover. Research into the foraging behaviour of bees is aimed at modelling the numbers of pollinators needed for optimal fertilization, determining its relationships with pollen and nectar production and weather, investigating pollen flow through and from crops and between groups of wild flowers and the interactions between different bee species. The spatial and temporal foraging behaviour of honey bees and bumble bees within agricultural areas is being compared and radar-tracking of individual bees is being used to determine their forage range flight dynamicsand forage preferences. The potential of good bee forage plants for enhancing the arable environment for bees by providing successional forage is being evaluated. The role of

semiochemicals in regulating foraging behaviour and bumble bee colony development is being investigated. A new Ph D project is investigating the role of pollen volatiles as cues for foraging honey bees and bumble bees. The work aims to help ensure sustainable production of entomophilous fruit and seed crops while minimizing environmental damage.

Research in the honey bee pathology section, led by Ms. Brenda Ball, has included studies on the properties, natural histories and means of control of protozoan, mite, fungal, bacterial and viral infections of bees. Recent research has shown that economic damage to varroa-infested honey bee colonies in the UK cannot be directly attributed to the feeding activities of mites but is due to elevated levels of other pathogens, especially viruses. Investigation of the factors affecting disease epidemiology in infested colonies and the role of the mite as an activator and vector of virus infections should provide options for the development of novel management or control strategies to reduce the damaging effects of mite infestation. The mechanism of virus induction in bees and the host response to parasitization are also being investigated.

A one year Rothamsted International Fellowship has enabled Dr. Dejair Message of the Federal University of Viçosa to investigate the cause of a serious honey bee brood disease in Brazil. Such observations on pathogens that appear to be exotic will enable a rational policy on the importation of honey bees to be maintained and equip British beekeepers with the knowledge necessary to reduce the impact of such infections should they become established.

INFORMATION EXCHANGE

Expertise in bee research is drawn upon by scientific colleagues world-wide and there are research links with institutes and universities in this country and abroad. Working visits can be arranged for overseas scientists wishing to gain experience or specialist skills in honeybee research and they make a valued contribution to established programmes.

Research findings are published in scientific journals but popular articles are also written for the beekeeping and agricultural press. Staff members serve on both national and international committees on diverse aspects of apiculture and lectures are presented to national and local beekeeping associations.

FUNDING

Rothamsted now forms part of the Institute of Arable Crops Research and receives funds for research from the Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council and through commissions and contracts from the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, from Levy boards, commercial and other organisations. Beekeeper support for bee research at Rothamsted has been received from both the C. B. Dennis British Beekeepers' Research Trust and the British Beekeepers' Association.

Candidates following the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme may receive information regarding the inclusion of beekeeping as a course submission from the Examinations Secretary.

The CSL National Bee Unit is part of the MAFF Central Science Laboratory research agency. It provides diagnostic, consultancy and research services to MAFF, commerce and to be keepers, both amatuer and professional. The Unit has modern facilities, including laboratories with first class computer support, as well as 150 bee colonies and the apiary buildings to support them. The Unit laboratories work to the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory Practice to ensure a high professional standard and, as well as being scientists, all technical staff are trained, practical beekeepers. The Unit is also supported by analytical chemists and agricultural and environmental specialists in the rest of CSL. The Unit relocated to a new CSL facility at Sand Hutton, near York, in November 1996.

STATUTORY WORK

The Unit examines thousands of samples of dead bees, brood combs and hive debris each year for evidence of serious pests and diseases, e.g. American & European foul brood (bacterial diseases of brood) and varroa mites. Much of this work, conducted under EC directive EC/65/92 and our own Bees Act 1980, is funded by MAFF, without charge to beekeepers.

The Unit is also the authorised MAFF facility for examination of queen bee consignments imported from countries outside the EC. (*Prospective importers should contact MAFF Horticulture & Potatoes Division, Eastbury House, 30/34 Albert Embankment, LONDON for further information*)

The Unit has responsibility for the MAFF & NAW bee health inspection programmes employing 8 full-time Regional Bee Inspectors and further 37 Seasonal Bee Inspectors throughout England and Wales for AFB, EFB and varroa mite inspections of beekeepers' colonies. They are also employed as bee health advisers to beekeepers, providing leaflets, talks and workshops, for example, on the control and treatment of serious diseases of honey bees. This work is funded by MAFF Horticulture & Potatoes Division & the National Assembly for Wales and carried out under the Bees Act 1980 and EC veterinary bee health check regulations..

PESTICIDE INCIDENTS

The Unit participates, with other CSL and MAFF specialists, in the Wildlife Incident Investigation Scheme, which monitors the environmental effect of pesticides on wildlife, including bees, on behalf of MAFF. Samples of bees from suspected pesticide incidents, sent in to the Unit by

beekeepers, are analysed for cause of death. The results are used to prevent recurrence of problems wherever possible. This work is presently conducted without charge to the beekeeper.

PESTICIDE TOXICITY

The Unit has a well-developed expertise in testing pesticide toxicity to honeybees to formal standards, e.g. European Plant Protection Organisation (EPPO) and the UK Control of Pesticides Regulations 1986. These include laboratory and field tests to assess the toxicity of compounds to both adult bees and broods.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Currently the Unit's research concentrates on the biology of the varroa mite infestations in British conditions so that more effective and appropriate diagnostic and monitoring tools may be made available to beekeepers. This work is funded by MAFF with a contribution from the British Beekeepers' Association.

Commercial research is also undertaken, e.g. testing new beekeeping appliances and feedstuffs and establishing the geographical and botanical origins of pollen in honey.

CONSULTANCY

Technical advice is provided in all aspects of apiary managment and bee husbandry to beekeepers and commercial and other organisations with an interest in beekeeping, e.g. bee farm planning appraisals. Consultancy also includes overseas work.

The Unit has long established links with many European and North American research centres, beekeeping specialists and beekeeprs to ensure an up to date knowledge of current beekeeping trends and research. It is also involved with training overseas bee specialists.

This was a valuable year for beekeepers in Northern Ireland. Honey output in some areas was high but low in others. For most it recovered after a bad start. Output from Apples and Rape was poor. European funding has been obtained to assist associations in their educational activities and is currently being disbursed.

The autumn survey of hives across the province revealed NO cases of varroasis.

During the autumn/winter 1996/97 the Department organised three Preliminary and two Intermediate courses in beekeeping. Forty-seven students attended the Preliminary course and forty-one the Intermediate course. Not all students chose to take the Preliminary examination conducted by the Federation of Irish Beekeepers Associations. However, the twenty-eight candidates who did were successful.

The number of successful candidates in this examination, in recent years, reflects a growing interest in beekeeping here.

Pesticide Incidents:

The Scottish Office Agriculture, Environment and Fisheries Department (SOAEFD) has responsibility for policy matters, the control of the movement of bees in the event of an outbreak of a statutory notifiable disease, maintaining records of disease incidents, issuing import licences for queen bees, initiating enforcement action where bee mortalities have resulted from the misuse or abuse of pesticides and for liaison with the Scottish Beekeepers Association.

SOAEFD Agricultural Officers, located at area offices throughout Scotland, carry out field inspections following notification of bee mortalities resulting from the misuse of pesticides. Bees Officers investigate notified incidents of statutory bee diseases.

The Scottish Agricultural Science Agency (SASA) has responsibility for the analysis of pesticides in dead bees.

BEE DISEASES

Under the Bee Diseases Control Order 1982, beekeepers are required to notify SOAEFD of suspected cases of foul brood diseases or varroasis. These should be notifed to the Principal Agricultural Officer (PAO) at the nearest SOAEFD Area Office who will arrange for a Bees Officer to carry out an inspection. Brood combs or hive debris from colonies thought to be infected will be sent to SASA for laboratory examination. Alternatively, a beekeeper may send hive debris direct to Plant Health Section, (Bee Diseases), SASA, at the above address for examination for the parasitic mite, *Varroa jacobsoni*.

Following the detection of varroa in Devon in April 1992, widespread searches of bee colonies have been carried out in spring and autumn in Great Britain to assess the spread of the disease. No mites have been found in either of these searches in Scotland. The area of England and Wales have declared a Statutory Infected Area (SIA), and the movement of are prohibited. To prevent the spread of infection into Scotland, only queen bees with attendant workers may be moved exceptionally under licence, under both the Importation of Bees Order 1980 (from outwith Great Britain) and the Bee Diseases Control Order 1982 (from the SIA). Queen bees are inspected by the Bees Officer at the premises of the importer and attendant workers are sent to SASA of Varroa.

No charges are made for these services.

PESTICIDE INCIDENTS

As part of the Wildlife Incident Investigation Scheme, SASA undertakes analytical investigations into bee mortalities where pesticide poisoning may have been involved. Beekeepers should send samples of dead bees (200) direct to SASA, Chemistry Section, for analysis. In the case of major incidents, beekeepers are advised to contact the PAO at the nearest Area Office so that an early field investigation can be instigated. A report will be issued to the beekeeper and if appropriate, enforcement action under the Control of Pesticides Regulations 1986 will be initiated.

ANNUAL REPORT 1992 (Latest available to the BKA)

The Bee Diagnostic Service was transferred from Kildalton College to Clonroche on lst March 1992. A total of 195 beekeepers sent in 368 samples. Analysis of the samples received showed that Acarine and Nosema are still a common problem with bee colonies. The postal strike had a serious effect on the number of samples received as it coincided with the main examination period in beekeeping.

VARROASIS

The discovery of the mite *Varroa jacobsoni* in Devon in Southern England in early April of 1992 brings the threat of varroasis ever closer. Once the mite becomes established it cannot be eradicated and will eventually spread to all apiaries. However, it can be controlled by biotechnical or chemical treatments to enable beekeeping to be carried on. These methods involve extra manipulations and the chemical treatments are expensive.

The Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food have imposed a total ban on the importation of bees and queens to ensure that the mite is not brought into the country. In the meantime beekeepers should monitor their bee colonies by using hive inserts and the tobacco treatment to ascertain that the mite is not already here. A sample of the resulting debris should be sent to Richard Dunne, Kinsealy Research Centre, Malahide Road, Dublin 17, for analysis.
